**We proudly present TAS-FORCE (Truth Advocacy Service & Women Empowerment).**

TAS-FORCE is an advocacy organization dedicated to supporting women and vulnerable people facing injustice in our society and within marriage.

Our mission is to raise awareness about the legal, emotional, and social challenges women endure, and to advocate for fairness, accountability, and transparency within the justice system. We stand firmly against corruption, malpractice, and unethical conduct by lawyers, judges, or any individuals entrusted with upholding justice.

TAS-FORCE calls upon the Government and relevant authorities to implement reforms that reflect the realities and needs of modern-day women. Laws and policies must evolve to protect women's rights, ensure equal treatment, and strengthen accountability mechanisms within the legal system.

Through education, advocacy, and community engagement, we aim to empower women to speak up, seek justice, and reclaim their dignity.

## **Concerning the Serwah Fosu Legal Matter**

We acknowledge that the legal battle involving Mrs. Serwah Fosu has created tension within many homes across Ghana. While we recognize that this began as a private family matter, the court's verdict has now raised broader legal concerns that may affect innocent women nationwide.

The court acknowledged that under Ghana's customary marriage system, Mrs. Serwah Fosu is a lawful wife. However, the same ruling also recognized another party as a "common-law partner."

This raises important legal questions:

- Can a legally married man simultaneously enter into a common-law relationship?
- Does the concept of common law apply where one party is already legally married under customary law?
- Are Ghana's existing laws clear and consistent regarding such matters?

We respectfully call upon the appropriate judicial authorities to revisit this case for proper clarification and to ensure consistency in the interpretation of the law.

### **Call for Transparency and Accountability**

We further express concern about certain procedural issues raised during the court proceedings, including delays in delivering judgment without clear explanation. In the spirit of transparency and public confidence in the judiciary, we respectfully request that relevant oversight bodies review these concerns where appropriate.

Additionally, serious public questions have been raised regarding the actions of a law firm that publicly claimed to represent the late Daddy Lumba after his passing.

We respectfully ask:

- What legal authority permits representation of a deceased person without proper court documentation?
- Was there valid documentation authorizing decisions regarding burial and property matters?
- Were public statements supported by official court filings?

We also wish to raise concern about a widely circulated video in which a well-known influencer allegedly claimed to have misled a High Court judge in relation to an injunction application concerning the funeral arrangements of the late Daddy Lumba on 13th December.



Such statements—whether accurate or exaggerated—create a dangerous atmosphere of perceived corruption and weaken public trust in the judiciary. When public figures suggest that courts can be misled without consequence, it erodes confidence in the rule of law and encourages lawlessness.

To date, there has been no clear official communication publicly distancing the Court from these claims. This silence has contributed to a growing public perception that misleading the Court may go unpunished.

We therefore respectfully appeal to the appropriate judicial and investigative authorities to:

- Examine the claims made in the video;
- Clarify the facts to the public;
- Take appropriate action if any misconduct occurred.

Accountability must apply to all—lawyers, influencers, court officials, and any individual interacting with the justice system.

Public trust in the legal system is essential. When confidence in justice weakens, society risks instability. Accountability protects not just individuals, but the integrity of our nation.

## **Our Appeal**

We believe the voices of the people matter. Many Ghanaians have expressed concern that this verdict does not reflect the values and identity of our nation.

We humbly request that the Government of Ghana, through the appropriate judicial administrative authorities, facilitate an expedited hearing date at the Court of Appeal for the appeal case concerning Mrs. Serwah Fosu. We believe a timely review will provide much-needed legal clarification and restore public confidence in the justice system.

Swift judicial attention to this matter will help address growing public concern and allow our nation to move forward with unity, clarity, and renewed trust in the integrity of our judiciary.

Our laws must be reviewed and, where necessary, reformed to reflect modern realities while preserving cultural integrity.
